FOR A BIG BOLD FUTURE

BIG BOLD ASK

\$251 million more to provide child care assistance to 47,000 additional young children with family incomes below 200% of poverty each year

\$80 million more to provide preschool to 11,400 additional 4-year-olds with family incomes below 200% of poverty each year

BIG BOLD ASK

\$102 million more to fund school transportation fully each year

\$43 million more to create a Fund for Teaching Excellence each year

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Equity

 Reduced income barriers increase participation in high-quality programs that richly support the learning development of young children Kindergarten readiness that leads to improved reading/math

Excellence

 Funding that allows high-quality programs meeting or exceeding Level 3 requirements under Kentucky's All STARS rating system

K-12 PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Equity

- Reduced funding gaps between districts with different transportation needs
- Implementation of practices that raise results for all learners and especially for historically under-served student groups

Excellence

- Deeper support for educators
- Local funds freed up to reach Kentucky's high standards, including steps like expanded access to counselors, expert reading teachers, art teachers, and collaboration time
